## **Corporate Governance Paper Competition and Presentation Awards**

The Corporate Governance Paper Competition and Presentation Awards (Competition) organised by the Institute started in 2007. This Competition aims to promote the importance of good governance among local undergraduates and provide them with an opportunity to research, write and present their findings and opinions on the selected theme.

Current undergraduates of all disciplines in Hong Kong can enrol this Competition in a team of two to four members. Each enrolled team is required to submit a paper on the theme of not more than 5,000 words in English.

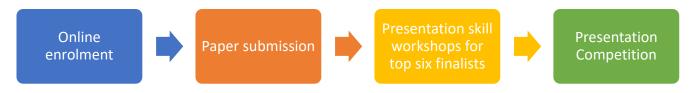
The six finalist teams will present their papers on Saturday 6 September 2025 to compete for the Best Presentation Award and Audience's Favourite Team Award.

#### About the theme - Is Governance a Driver for Growth

This year's theme is 'Is Governance a Drive for Growth?'

The global landscape is undergoing significant changes, influenced by the emergence of geopolitical dynamics and economic difficulties, such as fundraising issues, that affect businesses. In this climate of uncertainty, should companies focus solely on immediate survival, is there a role in governance as a driver for growth over the longer term?

## **Rules and regulations**

### Eligibility

Current undergraduates from all disciplines of local universities in Hong Kong in a team of two to four members.

#### Paper guidelines and requirements

- 1. Teams are required to:
  - a. read and follow the HKCGI writing style guide; and
  - b. state a bibliography at the bottom of the relevant page(s) and at the end of the paper, if made.
- 2. Teams are NOT allowed to put any group member or university/institution name(s) etc. for identification purpose in all pages except the cover page of the paper.
- 3. Topic and word count of the paper should be included in the cover page.
- 4. Footnote or bibliography will not be counted in the word count of paper.
- 5. Each team is required to submit the below on or before the deadline (Wednesday 18 June 2025):
  - a. the paper: no more than 5,000 words in English;
  - b. executive summary: no more than 100 words in English; and
  - c. photo(s) of each team member.
- 6. The paper, executive summary and photos should be saved in separate files with the following format:
  - a. the paper: CG Paper 2025\_[team leader's name];
  - b. executive summary: Executive summary\_[team leader's name]; and
  - c. photo: photo\_[full name] (e.g. photo\_Chan Tai Man)
- 7. Team will be disqualified if:
  - a. they provide with HKCGI any incorrect or false information; and/or
  - b. their submitted paper has infringement of any copyright of any third party\*
    - \* Plagiarism is a serious academic offence and all papers suspected of the same shall be disqualified at the absolute discretion of the reviewers or judges.

#### Photographs, video, sound records

This Competition shall be photographed, filmed and/or sound recorded, and all images and sounds (including any identifiable images and sounds of participants) will be used by HKCGI.

#### **Publication**

The Best Paper shall be published in the HKCGI monthly journal, <u>CGi</u>, together with the first and second runners-up papers to be published in the Booklet of the Competition, and other HKCGI publications and social media platforms.



### **Reviewers and judges**

- 1. A team of 10 to 15 academics from universities will review the papers.
- 2. A three-member panel judges who are governance professionals to review the six-finalist's paper and determine the Best Paper Award, first and second runners-up of the Paper Competition.
- 3. Another three-member panel judges from the profession to determine the Best Presentation Award on the presentation day.
- 4. The audience on the presentation day to vote and determine the Audience's Favourite Team.

#### **Prizes and Awards**

Decisions of the judging panels and the votes of the audience are final.

All teams submitted the paper will receive a certificate of participation. The prizes and awards of the Competition cannot be exchanged.
