Course Description

This course consists of supervised reading and written work. Candidates may specialize in one topic under the supervision of faculty members of the Faculty of Business and Economics. For the Economics field (ECON3293), examples of topics are: the problem of social cost, investment in human capital, general equilibrium theory, empirical methods in international trade, international monetary relations, theories of saving and the East Asian economies, and current economic problems of Hong Kong.

Candidates must submit the title of their project within the first two weeks of the semester for approval by the BEcon/BEcon&Fin Programme Director of the Faculty. An original project paper is required in lieu of a written paper in the Examination. The project paper must be completed and presented not later than the first day of the assessment period for that semester. Candidates shall submit a statement that the project paper represent their own work (or in the case of joint work, a statement countersigned by their co-worker(s), which shows the degree of their work) undertaken after the registration in the course.

E. Important Notes to Supervisors

- 1. The course offers opportunities for students to undertake research and to write up a project paper under the supervision of faculty members of the Faculty of Business and Economics.
- 2. In completion of the Reading course, students are required to submit <u>a project paper of 10,000 words</u> together with <u>a Turnitin report</u> for assessment.
- 3. Responsibilities of Supervisors:
 - (a) Help the student to define the topic of study for the project paper;
 - (b) Provide close guidance to the student and monitor the student's progress through to completion of the Reading course;
 - (c) Have regular meetings with the student at which all matters relating to the project paper can be discussed;
 - (d) Give comments on the preliminary version of the project paper to help the student to further improve the paper; and
 - (e) Give a final grade on the project paper and return the paper together with the Turnitin report to the Faculty Academic Area Administration Office (Room 736, K.K. Leung Building) for the Faculty's retention. The deadline for submission of the grade will be the last day of the assessment period of the enrolled semester.
- 4. The Faculty Area Administration Office is responsible for collecting the project paper and the Turnitin report from students. The student's submission will be passed the paper to the respective supervisor for grading.
