# **Application deadlines**

#### Semester 1 (February - June)

Nominations are due by **15 November**; applications and documents are due by **30 November**.

#### Semester 2 (July - November)

Nominations are due by **30 April**; applications and documents are due by **15 May**.

Late applications will be considered if there is enough processing time.



# Nomination information

Exchange/Study Abroad partners are required to nominate to UWA **first**, and then students will receive two emails:

- 1. To set up an account
- 2. To complete the application

To nominate a student, please complete the nomination survey.

# Supporting documents

All supporting documentation must be **UPLOADED** to the online application:

- A colour copy of the student's passport details page.
- The student's most recent official academic transcript. Postgraduate students must submit their undergraduate transcript. All transcripts must be in English.
- Evidence of English Language Competency.

Applications will only be assessed once **all** documentation has been received.

# Tuition fees\*

# Academic information

Standard academic load per semester = 24 credit points.

\* Most units (courses) have a value of 6 credit points.

# Unit (course) information/syllabi: Refer to the <u>UWA Handbook</u>.

NOTE: The term 'course' at UWA refers to the degree program, e.g. Bachelor of Science. NOTE: The term 'unit' at UWA refers to an individual class, e.g. BIOL1130 Core Concepts in Biology. Undergraduate units: Level 1, 2 or 3 (e.g. BIOL1130) Postgraduate units: Level 4 or 5 (e.g. MGMT5511)

Class format: Lectures, tutorials, labs, practicals. Language of instruction: English.





### Academic requirements Undergraduate students

- Completion of one semester of study.
- Be in Good Academic Standing as determined by the home institution (UWA's partner university).
- Meet UWA's English language requirements.

#### Postgraduate students

• Completion of a bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in order to take classes at a postgraduate level.

**MBA students:** To be admitted as an exchange or Study Abroad student into the <u>UWA (Flexible) MBA program</u> (offered on a trimester basis), students are required to have a minimum of two years' professional work experience and an IELTS of 7.

#### **Restricted courses**

Students may apply for any unit which is part of a standard course of study except for units within the **Medical School**  and the **Dental School**. Other units may be restricted and some units may also be quota restricted.

Postgraduate units in the **School of Psychological Science** are not available to exchange/Study Abroad students. Please note that **core Law units** will not be available to exchange/Study Abroad students. Contact your GLO adviser directly for more information on available Law units.

#### Grading scale

# **Registration (enrolment)**

Students can enrol prior to arrival with their Approved Study List. Students may request approval of units by completing a **Proposed** Study List in the online application.

A UWA Academic Adviser will assess the proposed study plan for prerequisites and other restrictions. On-campus enrolment support and academic advice is offered during Orientation. The add/drop period is open for the first week of classes.



# **English proficiency**

Students for the exchange program to UWA must satisfy one of the standard English Language Competency (ELC) requirements set out below, or such other language proficiency requirements as specified in a formal Memorandum of Agreement.

# UWA standard English language competency requirements:

- IELTS 6.5 (no individual band less than 6.0).
- TOEFL (iBT) 82 Overall, with a min score of 22 Writing, 18 Reading, 20 Speaking and 20 in Listening.

Additional tests are available.

#### Alternative English Language Pathway

Students who do not meet the standard ELC requirements as set out above may be approved admission to UWA on the basis of the Alternative English Language competency requirements. Students gaining admission via this pathway are assessed on a case-by-case basis and, if approved, they must enrol in the following unit in their first semester enrolment:

# Professional and Academic Communication (PACM1100)

Minimum scores for this conditional offer are:

- IELTS: 6.0 (no band score below 5.5)
- Internet-based TOEFL: 70 (17 in listening, 19 in speaking, 14 in reading and 20 in writing)
- UWA CELT English language pathways: English Academic Pathway 65% (no band less than 60%), Bridging Course Module 1 65% (no band less than 60%)

#### English language bridging courses

Students who do not meet the standard ELC or alternative pathway requirements may wish to consider enrolling in the 20-week <u>English</u> <u>Language Bridging</u> course. Tuition fees are payable but discounts may be available for students from partner universities.



### Welcome to UWA Arrival and Orientation

Recommended arrival dates: Students should arrive a day or two before Orientation if housing has already been prearranged. We recommend that students who have not secured any housing arrive at least two weeks before classes start.

#### Cost of Orientation program (if any): Not

applicable, but optional excursions will incur a small fee.

#### Airport pick-up

A **free** 24-hour airport pick-up service is available if students have applied for housing in one of the University residential colleges, or if their final destination on arrival is within the University precinct (Nedlands, Crawley, Subiaco, Shenton Park or the Perth CBD). Students can apply for airport pick-up and temporary housing once they have accepted their offer.

### Accommodation On campus

Information on on-campus accommodation is available.

Guaranteed accommodation is available to commencing students either at one of the residential colleges on campus or at the <u>Perth</u> <u>CBD premises</u>.

# College accommodation application process

Students can log onto the <u>UWA Residential</u> <u>College Application Portal</u> and apply to live on campus in one place. They rank their college peferences from 1-5 and the portal will automatically send their application to the colleges (starting with their first preference). Students should apply for accommodation as early as possible. There is a fee for the housing application.

### Student life Student visa information

Are students required to obtain a student visa? Yes. Once students return the signed acceptance contract with applicable payment, UWA will issue a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) document which will allow students to apply for an Australian Student Visa (ASV). Visas can take 2-4 weeks to be approved.

#### Are students allowed to work?

Students on an ASV can work up to 40 hours per fortnight during semester and unlimited hours during University holidays.

#### Working Holiday Visa (WHV)

Instead of a Student Visa, some students may be eligible to apply for a Working Holiday Visa (WHV). Please see the following website for the different categories and conditions of a <u>WHV</u>. Students coming to UWA on a WHV should be aware of the following considerations:

- Students are not entitled to Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) but must accept the responsibility to arrange their own health insurance and acknowledge that they must cover their own expenses while in Australia.
- Students will not be covered by the Education for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act which protects the interests of overseas students studying in Australia.



# Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is an Australian Student Visa requirement. UWA can arrange OSHC for students through Allianz. Alternatively, students can purchase their own through one of the other Australian providers. Students must provide evidence of this when submitting their acceptance documents. Further information is available at the Department of Home Affairs.

Most students from Sweden, Norway and Belgium do not have to purchase the OSHC.

New Zealand and Australian citizens will be eligible for <u>Medicare</u> and do not require OSHC.

Are students able to apply for an insurance waiver if they have their own insurance coverage? *No. OSHC is an Australian Government requirement.* 



### **Student services**

# Fees other than tuition (e.g. student services)

There is a compulsory Students Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF).

\*Exchange students are exempt from paying the SSAF. However, the fee will be applicable to Study Abroad students and must be paid during the semester. Failure to pay this fee will encumber the student and it will not be possible to release a transcript at the end of the program.

# Transcripts

Transcripts will be sent at the completion of the exchange period (either August or January) to the home institution or agent, as applicable.
