Postgraduate exchanges: Letter of Recommendation (on official headed paper)

Architecture exchanges: copy of, or link to, the student's portfolio

requirements

Students whose first language is not English must provide evidence of their English language level as part of their application.

Those who will need a Study Visa to enter the UK must submit a valid Secure English Language Test certificate.

**JYA English Plus**

Students must submit a valid IELTS academic for UKVI certificate taken at an approved test centre:

Choosing modules	<p>It is important that students choose carefully at the application stage because modules will be registered before arrival and it may not be possible to make changes after arrival.</p> <p>It is not possible to guarantee that students will be able to take exact equivalents to modules taught at the home university.</p> <p>Advice about making choices is available here:  <a href="http://www.kent.ac.uk/courses/short-term/how/modules.html">http://www.kent.ac.uk/courses/short-term/how/modules.html</a></p> <p><b>JYA English Plus:</b>  JYA English Plus students must perform to the required level on the EAP course in order to progress to study undergraduate modules. Successful students will be guided through the module selection process.</p>
Credits	Undergraduate courses are worth 15 Kent credits (= 7.5 ECTS) or 30 Kent credits (= 15 ECTS). Postgraduate courses are usually worth 20 Kent credits (=10 ECTS).
Normal Course Load	60 Kent credits (30 ECTS) each in the Autumn and Spring Terms 120 Kent credits (60 ECTS) for the full academic year
Module level	<p>Undergraduates should choose modules in Levels 4, 5 and/or 6. (Exchange students in Psychology may choose modules from Level 4 or Level 6. Level 5 modules are restricted.)</p> <p>Postgraduates should choose modules in Level 7. It is not possible for undergraduates to take Level 7 modules.</p>
Restrictions	<p>Exchange students are subject to any enrolment caps or prerequisites for individual modules.</p> <p><b>A small number of modules are not available to exchange students.</b> Restrictions are usually noted in the module description in the online Module Catalogue. If it is essential that you take a particular module in order to attend Kent, you may wish to check this with us prior to application.</p> <p>Law modules are only available to students studying at institutions with whom we have a direct Law exchange.</p>
Assessment	<p>Assessment may take various forms, for example coursework essays, oral presentation, group work or exams.</p> <p><b>All</b> exams take place in the Summer Term (May-June). The resit period takes place in August.</p>

Students whose study period finishes in December or April will not be present for the exam period. If students in this situation choose modules which have an exam, the School may be able to set an extra piece of coursework in lieu of the exam. Please note this option is not available for all modules. The Erasmus and Study Abroad team will contact you to select alternative modules if necessary.

All spring & summer term students and full-year students are required to sit any examinations in the Summer Term, where applicable. An alternative form of assessment is not allowed.

Official Transcript

At the end of the period of study, the University of Kent will issue one official electronic transcript to the student's home institution. We can also issue hard copies on request. A copy of the grading system is included in the transcript.

Students finishing in December: transcript will be published in February

Students finishing in April or June: transcript will be published in July

## VISAS

Applying for a visa	Students can check which visa route is appropriate on the Government website: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa">https://www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa</a>  Students should <b>not</b> apply for a Short-term Study Visa because this is only for those taking an English Language course at a language school in the UK.  Students who are coming to Kent for 6 months or longer and will need a Student Visa, will receive a CAS number from the University once their application has been processed. This can take some time so we recommend that students submit their complete application as early as possible.  JYA English Plus students who successfully complete the pre-sessional course will be advised about the visa application for the undergraduate course period by International Programmes.
