Applications

Applications open March/ September

Deadlines:

- Semester 1 (Sep-Jan): 15 March
- Semester 2 (Feb-Jun): 15 September

Acceptance emails and visa support letters sent by June/November.



University Accommodation

- Apply for university accommodation in Stag Hill (main campus) or Manor Park in June/ November
- Prices to suit various budgets (£85-£289 per week, including utilities, broadband and insurance)
- Room allocations: August/early December
- Student flats include mainly single bedrooms with shared kitchens
- Ensuites available
- No meal plans available.

Living Costs:

- Average living costs for students: around GB£1,136 per month, including accommodation
- Students coming under an exchange agreement don't pay tuition fees to Surrey.

Entry Requirements

- Must study full-time (30 ECTS credits per semester), unless you only need 22.5 ECTS
- GPA of 2.6 on the 4.0-point scale;
 - 3.3 on the 5.0-point scale; 4.6 on the 7.0-point scale, or the equivalent
- Non-native English speakers must meet the English language requirement for your chosen [Undergraduate/Postgraduate](#) course(s)
- Non-native English speakers applying for a Student visa must submit one of our [accepted English language qualifications](#) at the required level for your course with your application. Visitors coming for 6 months or less can submit a letter from your home institution confirming you meet the English language requirement for your Surrey course and stating your [CEFR level](#)
- A valid passport, ideally with at least 6 months of validity remaining after the end of your stay.
