## Matriculation & Visa Process

Students will send their unofficial transcript, photo & English language proficiency test results (*results cannot be more than 2 years old*) to the IBEX Exchange Office. Students will also complete two application forms – one to be matriculated as students at NYU and another to apply for the DS-2019 (Certificate of Eligibility for J-1 visa status). The DS-2019 will be generated and emailed by [NYU's Office of Global Services \(OGS\)](#). This important form is one of the documents required to apply for the J-1 student visa at a local US consulate or embassy. Students will receive their acceptance letter via email, which is also required for the visa application.

Please note that the processing fee for the DS-2019 is \$90. Students are also **required** to attend the OGS Orientation at the start of the semester. IBEX exchange students have full access to the services offered by the Office of Global Services throughout their exchange.

## NYU Housing & Accommodations

Students have the option of applying for NYU-on campus housing or seeking off-campus accommodation. As there is limited capacity, the NYU Housing Office cannot guarantee on-campus housing (particularly for Fall). Students are provided with an off-campus resource guide. ## Living Costs\*

\*Costs listed are estimate based on current AY pricings and are subject to change.

- **Housing:** Varies between \$5,120 to \$13,360 USD per semester
- **Food:** You have the option to enroll in a NYU meal plan, which can range from approximately \$1,616 to \$3,225 USD per semester.
- **Books:** Approximately \$900 to \$1,100 USD per semester
- **Local Transportation:** Free NYU shuttle buses to NYU buildings and residence halls. New York City subway and bus service is accessible to all parts of the city (\$2.90 per one-way trip).
- **Health Insurance:** The estimated 2025-2026 year-long annual fee for students (Comprehensive Plan) is \$4,177. Fall semester students only: \$1,614. Spring semester students only: \$2,563 (higher because it also covers summer). Required Immunizations: *All students* must show proof of immunizations. - Students can take classes from a variety of departments and concentrations. Certain restrictions and caps apply:
  - maximum of two finance courses and/or two economics courses per semester
  - maximum of one non-Stern course (pending approval/availability) per semester
  - no graduate level (MBA) courses

### Learning Expectations

<b>Class Format</b>	Combination of lecture, group projects and experiential learning
<b>Grading</b>	A (highest grade), A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D+, D, F (failing)
<b>Class Size</b>	Varies from 25 to 100 students depending on the subject
<b>Course Load</b>	12 to 18 credits a semester (average student takes 16 credits). These credits are comprised of 2, 3, and 4 credit courses, so a student could take 4 to 6 classes for a full-time schedule. Most courses are 3 or 4 credits.
<b>Examinations</b>	Grades are determined by a combination of one or more factors, which could include exams, group projects, papers, class participation, and presentations.

### English Language Ability

<p>All courses are conducted in English and involve discussion, group work and presentations that require strong English speaking and listening skills.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students from partner universities in Australia, the United Kingdom, Singapore, or from Hong Kong University of Science &amp; Technology do not need to submit any proof of English language ability.</li> <li>• Students in a degree program taught entirely in English at their home university must provide a letter stating such – on official letterhead, dated, and signed by their international office. It must describe how this English language ability was determined for entrance into the home university program.</li> <li>• Students who do not fit into one of the two categories above must provide test results with the minimum scores listed below:                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 100 and above on the TOEFL iBT (Home Edition Accepted)</li> <li>• 130 and above on the Duolingo English Test</li> <li>• 7.5 and above on the IELTS Academic</li> <li>• 70 and above on the PTE Academic</li> <li>• 191 and above on the Cambridge English Scale</li> <li>• 4.5 and above on the iTEP</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
