

FIVE IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE

(1) Leave of Absence

- You should inform the Faculty Office and seek approval
 - Sick leave (with medical certificate)
 - Non-medical leave (e.g., full-time internship):
 application must be submitted <u>BEFORE</u> the end of the add/drop period of the semester concerned
- Partial leave of absence, i.e., taking leave for particular courses, is <u>NOT</u> allowed under all circumstances
- No Course Enrollment ≠ Leave of Absence



(2) Examinations

	1 st Semester	2 nd Semester
Exam period	December	May
Release of exam timetable	November	April
Release of exam results	January	June

ABSENCE FROM EXAMINATION

- Normally result in <u>automatic failure in the examination</u> component of the course concerned.
- For absence on medical grounds, you should submit your medical certificate within 7 calendar days.
- Only <u>ONE</u> supplementary examination will be given.
- Partial attendance in examination on medical grounds will normally
 <u>NOT</u> be granted supplementary examination unless under very
 special circumstances.



(3) Honours Classification

Class of Honours	Graduation GPA (GGPA)* Range
First Class Honours	3.60 - 4.30
Second Class Honours	(2.40 - 3.59)
Division One	3.00 - 3.59
Division Two	2.40 - 2.99
Third Class Honours	1.70 – 2.39
Pass	1.00 - 1.69

*Students who have successfully completed 6 Common Core (CC) courses, the calculation of Graduation GPA (GGPA) is subject to the proviso that either 5 CC courses with the highest grades (covering all 4 Areas of Inquiry), or all 6 CC courses will be counted towards GGPA, depending on which generates the higher GGPA.



(4) Discontinuation of Studies

- You will be recommended for <u>discontinuation of</u> studies if you have:
 - Failed to pass at least 36 credits in 2 consecutive regular semesters; OR
 - Failed to achieve an average Semester GPA of 1.0 or higher for 2 consecutive regular semesters; OR
 - Failed to pass a particular course / fulfil a particular requirement for 3 times; OR
 - Exceeded the maximum period of registration.



(5) Plagiarism and Cheating

- Extremely serious intellectual crime
- Will be reported to the University (zero-tolerance policy)
 - May result in severe disciplinary penalties, including:
 - Reprimand
 - "Failed" grade
 - Suspension of study
 - Expulsion from the University
- Ignorance or unawareness is not an excuse

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
